## Oppose H.R. 910, the Energy Tax Prevention Act




On behalf of the BlueGreen Alliance, and our fourteen partners, I would like to express our opposition to H.R. 910, the Energy Tax Prevention Act, which would block the Environmental Protection Agency's duty, as declared by the Supreme Court in its decision in Massachusetts vs. EPA, to update vital clean air standards to begin addressing climate change.




This legislation would not only block the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) ability to protect America's families through the Clean Air Act, but it would also directly attack the scientific finding that climate change is a threat to public health and welfare.













Our Alliance worked in the 111<sup>th</sup> Congress to advance comprehensive climate and energy legislation that would have helped us achieve this balance. But Congress failed to finish the job, and the problem of a worsening environment remains. Unfortunately, because of this, the creation of hundreds of thousands clean energy jobs has been thwarted.



In March of this year the BlueGreen Alliance released a statement on the importance of EPA regulations under the Clean Air Act and the need for action on complementary policies to ensure the U.S. remains competitive while creating millions of U.S. jobs.
